Staffing

We are delighted to welcome Ms. Gráinne Kehoe to our permanent teaching staff for next year. Shauna Dunne and Rachel Rath, two of our wonderful SNAs, will also stay on next year covering job share and career break positions.

New Autism Class

We were delighted to recently receive the sanction from the National Council for Special Education to open our second autism class in September 2025. Enrolment for this new class will take place later this year, and we encourage you to let anyone know who may wish to apply for a place for their child.

Reconfiguration Works

We applied for reconfiguration works for the wing to the front right of our school where our autism classes are located and are delighted that this has been approved by the department. This will mean that the facilities in this wing of the school will be completely upgraded for our autism classes. A project management company named KSN Management has been appointed by the Department of Education to oversee this work. They have carried out a viability report and we hope to get confirmation soon that the works will go ahead over the summer.

Additional School Accommodation

We are thrilled to have been granted approval to build additional accommodation in the form of SET rooms, due to the fact that we are losing a number of our current SET rooms to make space for our second autism class. The Board of Management has invited architects to tender for the consultancy role in this building project and hope to see it progess further over the coming months.

Emergency Works

Emergency Floor Replacement Works will take place over the summer holidays in the front right wing of the school. These rooms have suspended timber floors which are collapsing, and need to be completely gutted and new concrete floors. GJM Contracts have been appointed to complete this work over the summer break.

Green Schools Day of Action

On Friday 14th June we celebrated our Green School Marine Themed Action Day. Enrolment

Our enrolment process for September 2024 has now concluded but we are still taking enrolments for our mainstream classes.

Morning Supervision- School gates do not open until 9.10am, and no pupils should be on the premises before this. Morning supervision is outdoors, and on wet days, children must wait in the shelter until school opens at 9.20am.

Parking- Please remember to park with care on the street outside the school. Do not double park or block access to staff cars. The car park spaces provided are for staff use and the school bus <u>only</u>. We also ask that people please do not park directly opposite the school, as our bus for pupils with Special Educational Needs parks there. Please do not park in these spaces when dropping off or collecting your child from school. Please be conscious of how/where you park, taking the children's safety into account at all times.

Class Reports

Ms O'Gorman's Junior & Senior Infants

We have had a wonderful Term 3 in Junior and Senior Infants.

We covered the themes of 'Siopadóireacht', 'An Teilifís' agus 'An Trá' sa Ghaeilge, learning lots of new vocabulary and songs in each area. I am so impressed with the children's proficiency in using the language at the end of this school year, and look forward to seeing them all build on this next year.

Our Aistear themes have been 'The Construction Site', 'The Garden Centre' and 'The Beach'. Our learning has been integrated around these themes and the children have produced fabulous artwork in each area, using the mediums of clay, construction, paint and drawing. Everyone really enjoyed the role play areas in each theme, and recently, when whether allowed, we were able to take our beach and construction themed play outside in the afternoons.

In Science, the children have been learning all about the strand of energy and forces, and heating and cooling. They have constructed tinfoil boats, and done experiments based on floating and sinking

and learned to recognise the differences between hot and cold in terms of weather, food, water and the body.

We have worked on data in Maths and also been renewing our focus on number, and addition and the use of number lines and forming numbers.

The children have really enjoyed participating in paired reading with their partners in 4^{th} and 5^{th} class, and I encourage them to keep up their reading at home over the summer. We have been doing lots of descriptive and recount writing and the children are looking forward to bringing these pieces of work home over the next while.

I wish all Junior and Senior Infants and their families a lovely summer break.

Ms Lawlor's Senior Infants & 1st Class

May and June have gone by too fast in our classroom and the children are now very much looking forward to their long summer holiday ahead. We are currently enjoying Active Schools Week and the children had fun on our recent school tour to Woodfield House where they painted, made giant bubbles, dressed scarecrows, made butter, listened to a funny story and lots more.

In English lessons we have been reading some summer themed stories such as The Lighthouse Keeper's Rescue and Mr. Turkey's Sandtastic Beach Day. Our role-play area has been transformed from a garda station to a tropical beach. The children are learning about human made and natural features of a beach along with staying safe on the beach. This theme ties in with An Trá in Irish.

In history lessons we are learning about stories from other countries. We chose a story from Italy which is a legend about how blackbirds got their black feathers; maybe your child could retell this story to you! We hope to read a few myths and legends from Ireland over the next week too. In art there have been lots of lovely art projects such as constructing a lighthouse with junk and a squabbling seagull, all of which will be making their way home this week.

I would like to wish Rang 1 the very best as they go on to 2^{nd} Class. I've really enjoyed teaching them all over the past 2 years and I'll look forward to seeing Senior Infants again in 1^{st} class at the end of August. Have a lovely summer everyone!




