Junior and Senior Infants have been super busy since Halloween. They have explored the themes of 'The Restaurant', 'The Supermarket' and 'Santa's Workshop', and have enjoyed imaginative roleplay, small world activities, construction and art in these areas. They have also learned about the builder, and had a Q&A session with Jim, the building foreman who is managing the project at our school at present.

The children worked on number, shape and space, transformations and length in maths over the past few weeks, and d'fhoghlaim said faoi bhia agus an Nollaig sa Ghaeilge.

In literacy, the children continued their great work at phonological awareness, and learning the various new sounds at their respective class levelsl. Juniors have started reading some words and we are very impressed by their progress. Senior Infants are also making wonderful progress with their reading. We have read the 'Hungry Caterpillar' and some beautiful Christmas stories. The children have been doing lots of free writing, dictation and letter formation practice.
